Do you have a feline explorer visiting your property or do you think a cat may be abandoned or lost?

Print a paper collar

This is a great way to check if a wandering cat has a home, and may help answer some questions for the cat's guardian (owner).

If you are concerned for the cat's welfare please call the local SPCA as soon as possible. If the cat looks well then continue to use the paper collar for two weeks before calling the SPCA.

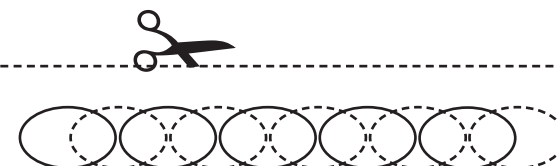
We do not recommend welcoming the cat into your home.

- Print out this template & write out your phone number on the collar
- Cut out the collar along the dotted line
- Have a short piece of sellotape within easy reach
- Place the collar around the cat's neck. You might need to distract the cat while you do this. Overlap the ends so the collar fits snugly and secure with the sellotape - you should be able to get two fingers comfortably between the collar and the cat's neck.
- If the cat removes the collar in a short time period please try again.



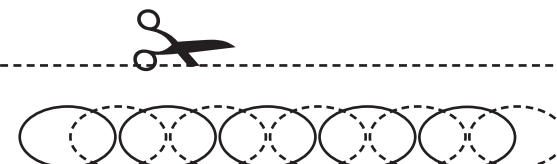

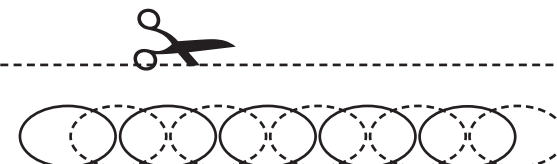
